PRESENTATION OF ANALYSIS OF HIV SERVICES PROVIDED TO MSM IN ARMENIA MSMIT

Meeting-discussion, entitled “Presentation of Analysis of HIV services provided to MSM in Armenia” was held on 23 July 2021, organized by New Generation



Humanitarian NGO within the grant issued by Eurasian Coalition for Health, Rights, Sexual and Gender Diversity (ECOM) as a part of the Eurasian Regional Consortium, funded by the Robert Carr Fund for civil society networks (RCF).

Representatives of NGOs working with MSM and other field organization, RA Ministry of Health, National Center for Infectious Diseases of RA MoH, The Country Coordinating Mechanism against HIV/AIDs, Tuberculosis and Malaria of RA (CCM) as well as MSM community participated in the meeting.

At the beginning of the meeting, NGO president Sergey Gabrielyan made an opening speech, thanking the guests for accepting the invitation and being present at the meeting. He also presented the agenda of the meeting.

The participants of the meeting had an active discussion on the analysis, made suggestions and observations, which will be taken into account in the future when developing an Advocacy roadmap addressing the issues and gaps. The meeting discussion was held in an atmosphere of active discussion and questions and answers.

The first speaker at the meeting was Elena German, Capacity Development Coordinator at ECOM, who presented the “Comparison of the Armenian Cascade of HIV Services with other regional cascades”, talking about the UN HIV prevention indicators and the work to be done to achieve those indicators as well as about Practical Guidance for Implementing HIV and STI Programs with MSM (MSM Implementation Toolkit – MSMIT).

The second speaker was national expert Hmayak Avetisyan who presented the Analysis of HIV services provided to MSM in Armenia,

speaking about the aim and objectives, structure and methods of the research. The issues and gaps identified during the analysis were also presented in 5 sections – Community Empowerment; Addressing Violence against MSM; Condom and Lubricant Programming; Health-Care Service Delivery; Using Information and Communication Technology. At the end of the speech recommendations and conclusions were presented which will be summarized in Advocacy plan.



AWARENESS OF ARMENIAN YOUTH ABOUT HIV AND AIDS, ACTIVITIES CARRIED OUT IN THE FIELD. FOCUS GROUP DISCUSSION



On July 2, 2021, the first focus group discussion was held with participation of young people of Armenia within the framework of the survey on the Actuality of Recognition of the youth as a key population for HIV prevention programs.

The expert of the focus group discussion was MD Hovhannes Madoyan.

This focus group discussion was held for male students of Armenian higher education institutions.

The goal of the meeting was to discuss the awareness of the Armenian youth about HIV and AIDS, the HIV/AIDS related activities carried out among young people of Armenia, the importance of targeted work in relation with HIV and AIDS for the Armenian youth.

Also the topic of HIV and AIDS taught within the school subject Healthy Lifestyle and the interventions related to HIV and AIDS that would be desirable to implement among the youth were discussed during the meeting, Another three focus group discussions will be held within the frames of this survey among different groups of youth, i.e. female students, and non-student youths to get a more comprehensive image on the situation for the survey.

THE PERSONS WERE BEATEN BECAUSE OF THEIR ALLEGED SEXUAL ORIENTATION AND GENDER IDENTITY

On June 15, 2021, trans* person D.M. (name is changed), beneficiary of New Generation Humanitarian NGO (NGNGO) applied to NGNGO. The trans* person reported that she had been walking with her friends, when a group of people, making assumptions about their sexual orientation and gender identity, insulted and cursed at them. Realizing the seriousness of the situation, D.M. and her friends ignored all that and continued their walk. However, those people followed D.M. and her friends, attacked the latter, kicked them and dragged them with their hands. D.M. and her friends were not injured, only their clothes were torn. Legal consultation was provided by the lawyer of New Generation Humanitarian NGO, it was suggested to submit a report on the crime. However, the latter refused.

According to the NGNGO analysis of cases, in 2020-2021 there was an increase in the number of cases of discrimination, violence and torture on the grounds of people's sexual orientation and gender identity in Armenia. This case comes to prove once again that the discriminatory, intolerant attitude of the society towards individuals due to their sexual orientation and gender identity is very deep and obvious.



The region of Eastern Europe and Central Asia demonstrates a lack of strategic information about trans* people which results in a wide range of challenges for trans* people and a lack of resources used to overcome barriers. In order to address the existing challenges and barriers the project “Trans*Map in EECA” started in September 2019. The Armenian component of the project is implemented by New Generation Humanitarian NGO (NGNGO). To address specific challenges and issues that trans* people face on a country level, national expert group, consisting of three persons (Alina Mirzoyan – lead person, Arman Sahakyan and Hmayak Avetisyan) was gathered, which will develop the Armenian National Advocacy Plan (NAP). In order to design a reliable and trustworthy NAP and make the voice of trans* people heard, a focus-group discussion (FGD) with participation of the national expert group and Armenian

Trans* People Working Group (ATPWG) was held. Welcoming speech was made by NGNGO president Sergey Gabrielyan who once again highlighted the importance of the ATPWG format and activity, urged the participants to be active and demanding and the representatives of organizations dealing with trans* issues to make the voiced of their trans* beneficiaries heard during all kind of meeting-discussions. During the start of the event, the lead person Alina Mirzoyan presented all available data related to the conditions of trans* people in Armenia and then, the key points that should be included in the NAP were identified through questions and discussion. The FGD was held in an environment of extremely active discussions. The resulting information and opinions pointed out during the discussions will help the national expert group develop a trans* community needs based NAP.

“GOD DID NOT GIVE AN ANSWER TO MY PRAYER”

The representatives of the community would oppose the priests, the latters would blame those people. Anyway, I present this article and leave the conclusions to the reader.

“You are at the age of Christ – 33 years old. Is that a sign?”

“At the age of 33, I realized that I am homosexual. For the first time, I wanted to have sex with a man. My partner was my childhood friend,” says Argam and continues that he could never imagine that it would turn out that way. “I will not hide, I liked it but one thought wouldn’t give me peace. I thought, “My Lord, have I committed a sin, what is my future life going to be?” Argam remembers 14 years later. He went to see a psychologist. He said, “There is nothing extraordinary, you are a human being, you have those inclinations, it is only surprising why your desire was revealed at this age. In general, these tendencies appear at an earlier age,” Argam tells. Feelings of guilt did not give him a rest, he decided to go to church and talk to the priest.

"The priest made an excerpt from the book of Genesis, I have memorized it by heart. And God created man in his own image. He created people in the image of God. He created them male and female. And God blessed them, and God said unto them, "Be fruitful, and multiply, and replenish the earth, and subdue it: and have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the fowl of the air, and over every living thing that move upon the earth". Then he instructed, "Son, the works of God are unsearchable, there is no need to interfere. You can be saved," Argam tells.

By the way, my interlocutor remembers that the priest also singled out his age. "My son, you are 33 years old – at the age of Christ. Maybe this is a sign from God that you should repent and be saved," the priest told Argam. According to Argam, he always goes to church, prays, lights a candle, but "continues to remain homosexual". "Maybe I will spend my heavenly life in hell or maybe I will repent until the end of my life but I like my image, why is it against God?" Argam asks everyone rhetorically.

Sin or delusion?

According to the priests, the rejection of homosexual behavior in the Bible is already in the book of Genesis, in the story of Sodom and Gomorrah, the destruction of which was mainly due to homosexual sin and lifestyle. According to Bishop Bagrat Galustanyan, the Bible and the teachings of the Holy Church unequivocally reject homosexual relations, considering it a violation of God-created human nature.

According to the Holy Father, some people think that the moral dictates of the Old Testament should be viewed differently, as most of them were related to ritual perceptions and requirements, such as not eating pork, circumcision, etc., which are no longer obligatory today. "This approach is wrong because even if ritual requirements are no

longer binding, moral dictation is still mandatory. In other words, the rituals dedicated to God are subject to change in different cultures at different times but the moral ethical requirements are eternal and obligatory for all cultures," Bishop Bagrat is convinced.

"Do you not know that the unrighteous will not inherit the kingdom of God? Be not deceived: neither fornicators, nor idolaters, nor adulterers, nor effeminate, nor abusers of themselves with mankind, nor thieves, nor covetous, nor drunkards, nor revilers, nor extortioners, shall inherit the kingdom of God" the Bible says.

In the New Testament, the apostle Paul, describing the environment of the Gentiles, considers homosexual relations to be the most serious addictions, degrading passions, which destroy the human nature and body.

"That's why God gave them over to insatiable passions, because their females exchanged natural needs for unnatural ones. In the same way, the males, leaving their natural needs for the female, became inflamed with their desires towards each other. The men were ashamed of the men; instead they accepted in themselves the recompense of their error. (Romans 1: 26-27).

We deny guilt, accept the guilty

According to Edward, a member of the LGBTI (Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender) Christian Forum, religion is a mechanism that governs people. Edward grew up in a family of believers who believe in God. He is 30 years old, until he was 23 years old he tried to repent. "Being a believer, I tried to be healed if they say it is a disease, I tried to repent if it is a sin. I realized that it is not a disease, it is not a sin. I have always prayed and received the answers to my prayers early.

I prayed for days that God would reveal me from this "evil" (meaning homosexuality -edit note), but I did not receive an answer. "I realized that it had to be that way, because God would answer me then," says Edward.

Father Yesayi Artenyan does not agree with Eduard's point of view. According to Father Isaiah, "it is an unsuccessful way of self-justification." My interlocutor mentions that no one forbids the representatives of the LGBTI community to come to church, to participate in rituals. "No one forbids such people to come to church, to participate in the ceremonies, but we definitely reject that phenomenon. In other words, we deny the sin, we accept the sinner," says Father Yesayi.

Due to his work, Eduard communicates with the representatives of the LGBTI community almost every day. "There is a stereotype that if you are lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, intersex, you can not be a believer. But there is no ban here. Christianity preaches tolerance, love, and it is amazing why they stone the LGBTI community," says Eduard. "The Church priests urge us to be tolerant of man, but not of sin," says Father Yesayi.

According to Bishop Bagrat, homosexual passion, like other passions that cause suffering to a fallen person, is the mutilation of human nature due to sin, which can be overcome in a spiritual sense. "Healing through prayer, fasting, repentance, reading the Bible and the writings of the priests, being involved in the circle of believers who are ready to provide spiritual support," says the Bishop and concludes with a quote from the Bible. "So, if you think you are standing firm, be careful that you don't fall! No temptation has come upon you except from men. But God is faithful, who will not tempt you beyond what you can bear. but with the temptation he shall show the way of salvation, that you may be patient (1 Corinthians 10:12, 13)".

Destroying love is a greater sin

LGBTI community and the Bible. Of course, you can not fit the topic in two or three pages, it is inexhaustible, debatable and I will start a journalistic investigation on the topic in the near future. And I would like to end this article with the point of view of Alex, an Armenian who participated in the LGBTI Christians Forum years ago.

According to him, "being homosexual is not a sin, a person does not choose his sexual orientation." According to Alex, there are far more warnings and restrictions in the Bible for heterosexuals than for homosexuals. "Everything can be found in the Bible. The Bible is a book that contains stories, dramas, and even divination by looking at a cup. If we were to be guided by the Bible, according to the Old Testament, we would stone women if they were not virgins, then stone naughty children and disobedient children. With this in mind, I would say to them, let us live by the message of Jesus Christ – Love your neighbor as yourself. And let us love one another. I would also like to emphasize that I do not call them to love sin, because love is not sin. "If a boy loves a boy, if a girl loves a girl, we should never try to break or destroy love. Destroying love would be a greater sin," says Alex.

MONEY WAS REQUESTED FROM NGNGO BENEFICIARY FOR DISTRIBUTION OF INFORMATION ABOUT HIS SEXUAL ORIENTATION

On June 25, 2021, New Generation Humanitarian NGO (NGNGO) beneficiary, homosexual person I.L. (name has been changed) applied to NGNGO. The latter reported that he has been persecuted and threatened to spread information about his sexual orientation in their building. Large sums of money was demanded from I.L in order not to spread his personal information. Applying to NGNGO, I.L. requested that a report be submitted on behalf of the Organization, as he did not want to go to the police. The latter expressed his fear that he might be subjected to double discrimination; information about his sexual orientation would be spread. Legal consultation was provided by NGNGO lawyer. The applicant was introduced to the procedure for submitting a report defined by the RA law. The case is under the control of NGNGO lawyers/attorneys.

Clarification

Article 182 of RA Criminal Code Extortion, the threat to publicize defamatory information or information inflicting significant damage to the person's or his relatives' rights or legal interests, the threat to use violence against the person or his relatives, or to destroy (damage) the property owned or managed by the person, his relatives or other persons, with a demand to surrender the property rights, or other actions involving property, is punished with a fine for the amount of up to 400 to 800 times of minimal salary or by imprisonment.

GENDER EQUALITY: NGNGO TRAINING AT POLICE EDUCATION CENTER OF ARMENIA

On June 29, 2021, New Generation Humanitarian NGO conducted a training on the topic of Gender Equality for police officers passing requalification at the Police Education Center of Armenia.

At the beginning of the training, the project coordinator Alina Mirzoyan greeted all the participants, introduced the organization and spheres of its activity,



the aim of the training, the topics, the experts, expressing gratitude to Police Academy and Education Center for the continuous cooperation.

After the greeting speech and introduction, training expert Shushan Khnkoyan proceeded to the presentation of the training topic, i.e. Gender Equality, first touching upon the topics of Human Rights Protection and Discrimination. Next, the trainer spoke about Gender Equality presenting statistics, gaps in the field, and settlement mechanisms.

The trainer presented international documents related to the topic, especially highlighting the Istanbul Convention and Lanzarote Convention, their real goals and the myths around them.

The whole training process was accompanied with active questions and answers, enthusiastic discussions.

IT WAS NOT POSSIBLE TO DISCOVER THE PREPARED MATERIALS ON THE TRAFFIC ACCIDENT OF NGNGO CAR. AN OFFICIAL EXAMINATION IS BEING CARRIED OUT

On October 27, 2018, a car belonging to New Generation Humanitarian NGO (NGNGO) parked in front of the office of NGNGO was hit by an unknown car in the evening and the driver left. The incident was videotaped by a nearby camera. The President of the Organization submitted a report on the incident, providing the video carrier. For about 3 months after that, the Organization did not receive any information about the incident – the investigation, the finding of the culprit, as well as other investigative actions. Moreover, it was not possible to get information about the course of the case even after

S. Gabrielyan personally visited the police station again. Meanwhile, it is clear from the video that the traffic police (TP) had arrived at the place of the incident, because in addition to the car belonging to the Organization, the unknown driver had also hit the other car in front. On 29.01.2019 the Organization sent a letter to the RA Traffic Police, asking to provide information on the progress of the case, but neither written nor oral answer was given to the inquiry.

The organization was forced to file a lawsuit in 2019 on the demand to oblige the RA Traffic Police Service to respond to the plaintiff's letter within three days. As a result, on November 20, 2019, the lawsuit was upheld by the RA Court of First Instance of the city of Yerevan. The court made a decision to oblige the defendant to respond to the plaintiff's NG-02-015-1901 letter sent on 29.01.2019 within three days and in favor of New Generation Humanitarian NGO to confiscate the amount of the state fee previously paid for the lawsuit and the payment of the plaintiff's representative.

Enforcement proceedings were initiated on October 23, 2020 by the RA Compulsory Enforcement Service. NGNGO has repeatedly applied to the RA Traffic Police Service, as well as to the Compulsory Enforcement Service, asking to instruct to provide the answer to the letter, but no response was received. In response to the regular application of NGNGO, on July 8, 2021, the response of the RA Compulsory Enforcement Service was received, to which the letter of the RA Traffic Police Service was attached. The RA Traffic Police Service informed that it was not possible to respond to the letter of January 29, 2019, as it refers to the materials prepared on the fact of the traffic incident which took place on Tumanyan Street in

Yerevan on October 27, 2018, which could not be found, in connection with which the Traffic Police is conducting an official investigation. ***New Generation Humanitarian NGO condemns such careless behavior of the RA Traffic Police Service. As a result of such inaction, many crimes are not revealed, the public trust in that structure decreases.***

We urge and call out to take immediate measures to find out under what circumstances the materials on the case have disappeared and to take appropriate action.

ANOTHER TRAINING AT POLICE EDUCATION CENTER OF THE REPUBLIC OF ARMENIA



The cooperation between New Generation Humanitarian NGO and the Police Education Center of the Republic of Armenia continues in the context of organizing training sessions for police officers passing requalification at the Education Center. Within this cooperation, Nushik Ter-Movsisyan, the expert of New Generation Humanitarian NGO and

lawyer of the Helsinki Citizens' Assembly Vanadzor Office conducted training sessions on the topics of the Right to Freedom of Assembly and the Right to be Free from Torture on July 7 and July 8, 2021. The first day of the training was dedicated to the topic of the Right to Freedom of Assembly, in the scope of which the trainer introduced to the participants the important normative legal acts regulating the field, types of assemblies, the norms of giving notice about the assembly, the role of the police and their actions, the international practice, legislation, the right of minorities to assembly. The topic of the training on July 8, 2021, was the Right to Be Free from Torture. Within the framework of the topic, the definition of torture was presented, the distinction between torture and bad attitude, as definition of violation of the Article 3 of ECHR, the specificities of examination of the cases of victims of torture, the International Standards for Torture and inhumane attitude, the positions expressed in the ECHR decisions were discussed, the statistics of torture cases at the criminal executive institutions, police and army of the Republic of Armenia were presented.

The training was concluded with questions and answers.

The cooperation with the Police Academy of the Republic of Armenia in this format has launched since 2019 and is going to be continuous.

THE STUDENT WAS BEATEN AT COLLEGE BECAUSE OF HIS SEXUAL ORIENTATION

On June 29, 2021, a homosexual person S.H. (name has been changed) applied to New Generation Humanitarian NGO (NGNGO). The latter reported that after the information about his sexual orientation was spread in the college, he always had problems with the college students. The latters have regularly insulted and ridiculed him. S.H. tried to stay away from the students so as not to complicate the situation.

However, once he could not manage to avoid the incident, and an argument started. The students beat S.H., as a result of which the latter received serious bodily injuries. To settle the issue, S.H. appealed to the college management. Unfortunately, no action was taken by them.

Once again, when he was beaten by the students, S.H. defended himself, then applied to the police.

Instead of arresting the people who had beaten S.H., the police detained him. No criminal case has been initiated by the law enforcement agencies, despite the existence of an obvious crime.

Legal consultation was provided by the NGNGO lawyer. The case is under the control of NGNGO lawyers/attorneys.

Sergey Gabrielyan, the president of New Generation Humanitarian NGO, highlights the importance of the steps taken by the relevant structures to solve the problem in such situations. “If steps were taken by the directorate in this case, it would be possible to avoid further aggravation of the situation.

NGNGO repeatedly reported similar cases when students dropped out of school due to such pressure and violence. “The organization will continue to work for the benefit of human rights,” said NGNGO president.

The training was organized by New Generation Humanitarian NGO within the framework of “Trans* Map in EECA project” with financial and technical support of the Eurasian Coalition for Health, Rights, Gender and Sexual Diversity (ECOM). It was aimed at raising awareness of the participants in the field of the methods and instruments of fundraising as well as development of grant application.

Before the start of the training NGNGO president Sergey Gabrielyan greeted the participants, presented the topic of the training and highlighted the importance of cooperation established with ECOM.

On the first day of the training, after greeting, getting to know each other and speaking about the expectations from the training, Capacity Building Coordinator of ECOM and trainer-expert Elena German presented the topic of fundraising, the types of resources, where and how to start fundraising, methods and instruments of fundraising, ethics.

The second day of the training was devoted to practical workshops and team-working activities due

to which the participants applied gained knowledge and information into practice, speaking about the cycle of grant application, development of grant application, precise and proper formulations, specificities of budgeting. The training was held in an atmosphere of active discussions.

At the end of the training active participants were awarded with certificates to prove their participation in the training.
